Alexander Rosenkranz & Florian Merdes Tempelhofer Feld

Much discussed, fiercely contested, dearly beloved - the so-called Tempelhofer Feld in Berlin is the subject of Alexander Rosenkranz and Florian Merdes's most recent photographic work.

Tempelhofer Feld is the largest inner-city open space in the world. The unbuilt landscape unfolds smack in the middle of the bustling urbanity of Berlin and is an oasis for the city's population. Whether in everyday life or for recreational activities, Tempelhofer Feld is a space that enables people to come together.

In an increasingly aestheticized world in which we alternate between digital, analog, and hybrid spaces, such a bare and supposedly undeveloped space is truly exceptional. It is precisely this void that drove Alexander Rosenkranz and Florian Merdes to capture the area in its specificity. Tilting, dancing horizons, abstract photographs of objects near and far, tender views of the sky at dusk -Tempelhofer Feld expands your gaze and throws you back onto yourself. It puts habits of seeing and thinking to the test, for the experience of it creates a novel space of perception outside of the everyday. At the same time, the unbuilt field encourages beholders to reflect on potential and possibility. How might one capture such forms of imagination and projection with photography?

In their work, Alexander Rosenkranz and Florian Merdes allow us to experience this unique space in new, experimental ways. The project was supported by the Haus am Kleistpark photo work scholarship.

Alexander Rosenkranz (b. 1987) and Florian Merdes (b. 1989) studied at the Academy of Fine Arts (HGB) Leipzig in the class for photography and media with Prof. Joachim Brohm. In 2021, Alexander Rosenkranz completed his studies as a master student (Meisterschüler). Florian Merdes completed his master's degree in the class of Stephanie Kiwitt at Burg Giebichenstein University of Art and Design Halle. Their work has been exhibited widely and won numerous awards. Following projects in Oslo, Leipzig, and Magdeburg, Tempelhofer Feld is their fourth artistic collaboration.
